The Board of Regents for the state of _____ Proper Noun authorized a short, voluntary _____ Noun for recitation at the start of each school day. This prayer was written by _____ Proper Noun state officials to be recited by public schoolchildren.

The _____ Proper Noun ruled that this was _____ Adjective, because it violated the First Amendments _____ Noun clause. By providing the _____ Noun, voluntary or not, _____ Proper Noun officially approved _____ Noun.

This was the first in a series of cases in which the _____ Proper Noun used the _____ Noun clause to eliminate _____ Noun - Plural activities. The _____ Noun forbids the sponsorship or encouragement, directly or indirectly, or _____ Noun by public school authorities. However, students may _____ Verb - Base Form silently to themselves because of freedom _____ Verb - Base Form clause.
