# Mark Zuckerbergs Early Years as a Software Developer

Zuckerberg began using computers and writing software as a child in middle school. His father taught him

\_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Programming in the 1990s, and later hired software developer David Newman to tutor him privately. Newman calls him a "\_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_," adding that it was "tough to stay ahead of him."

Zuckerberg also took a graduate course in \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural \_\_\_\_\_ at Mercy College near his home while he was still in high school. He enjoyed developing computer programs, especially communication tools and games. In

According to writer Jose Antonio Vargas, "some kids played computer games. Mark \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Tense \_\_\_\_\_ them." Zuckerberg himself recalls this period: "I had a bunch of friends who were \_\_\_\_\_ Animal (plural) \_\_\_\_\_ . They'd come
