Pregnancy Word Lib: Packing list for your hospital stay

You might want to pack two small bags for the hospital: one for the items you'll need during labor, and another for items that you won't need until after you give birth.

We recommend having everything ready to go when you're about eight months pregnant, since you could go into labor at any time in the weeks before your due date. Here's a list of things recommended by experienced moms:

- A Adjective Noun (or Noun), your insurance card, and any hospital paperwork you need

- Your Verb - Present ends in ING plan, if you have one

- Eyeglasses, if you wear them.

- Pack a few personal items, such as a Noun and Noun - Plural, lip balm, Noun - Plural, a brush and comb, Noun - Plural, and a hair band or barrettes. Hospitals usually provide soap, shampoo, and Noun - Plural, but you might prefer your own.
