Star Trek

Star Trek is an Adjective science fiction entertainment Noun created by Gene Roddenberry. The franchise began in Year with the television series Star Trek later referred to as Star Trek: The Proper Noun Series. This series, its spin-off shows: Star Trek: The Adjective Series[Note 1], Star Trek: The Next Proper Noun, Star Trek: Deep Space Number, Star Trek: Proper Noun, and Star Trek: Noun, as well as the Star Trek Noun series make up the core of the Star Trek mythos. While the critical response of the much of the franchise varies, many Adjective Star Trek episodes and films have won awards and Noun - Plural including Emmy Awards, Hugo Awards, and an Academy Proper Noun.

Westerns such as Proper Noun Train along with the Proper Noun Gulliver's Travels inspired Roddenberry when he created the Adjective Star Trek. The Original Series, followed the interstellar Noun - Plural of James T. Kirk and the crew of an Adjective vessel of a 23rd century galactic "United Proper Noun of Planets"--the Starship Enterprise. This series debuted in Year and ran for Number seasons on NBC. These adventures continued in the Adjective Star Trek: The Animated Series and Number feature films. Number spin-off television series were Adverb produced; Star Trek: The Next Generation, followed the crew of a new Starship Enterprise set a century after the Adjective series; Star Trek: Deep Space Nine and Star Trek: Voyager, set contemporaneously with The Next Generation; and Star Trek: Enterprise, set Preposition or subordinating conjunction the original series, in the Adjective days of human interstellar travel. produced. In 2009, the franchise rebooted[Note 2] in the film Star Trek featuring a new cast portraying the crew of the _____ Adjective _____ Enterprise. A sequel of the this film is scheduled for the summer of 2013.
