## **Trick-or-Treat**

Trick-or-treating is a customary practice for children on Halloween in many countries. Children in costumes travel from house to house in order to ask for <u>Noun-Plural</u> with the question Trick or treat? The "trick" is an idle threat to <u>Verb-Base Form</u> the homeowners if no treat is given.

In North America, trick or treat has been a customary Halloween tradition since at least the early 1950s. Homeowners wishing to participate in it sometimes decorate their <u>Adjective</u> <u>Noun - Plural</u> with artificial spider webs, plastic <u>Noun - Plural</u> and <u>Noun - Plural</u>. Some rather reluctant homeowners would simply leave a <u>Animal</u> in a bowl on the porch, others might be more participative and would even ask an effort from the children in order to provide them with candy.

Guising - children disguised in costumes going from door to door for <u>Noun - Plural</u> and <u>Noun - Plural</u> - predates trick or treat, and is recorded in Scotland at Halloween in 1895, where masqueraders in disguise carrying lanterns made out of <u>Adjective</u> turnips, visit homes to be rewarded with cakes, fruit and <u>Noun - Plural</u>.
