We hold these _____ Noun - Plural to be self-evident, that all _____ Noun - Plural are created _____ Adjective,
that they are endowed by their _____ Noun with certain unalienable _____ Noun - Plural, that among these are
Life, _____ Proper Noun and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to _____ Verb these rights, Governments are
instituted among _____ Noun - Plural, deriving their just powers from the _____ Noun of the governed, --That
whenever any Form of Government becomes _____ Adjective of these ends, it is the Right of the
_____ Noun - Plural to alter or to _____ Verb it, and to institute new _____ Noun, laying its foundation on
such principles and its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their _____ and Happiness.
Prudence, indeed, will dictate that _____ Noun - Plural long established should not be changed for light and
_____ Noun causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer,
while evils are _____ Adjective, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed.
But when a long _____ Noun of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design
to reduce them under absolute _____ Noun, it is their right, it is their _____ Noun, to throw off such
Government, and to _____ Verb new Guards for their future security.--Such has been the _____ Adjective
sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which _____ them to alter their former Systems of
_____ Verb. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a _____ Noun of repeated injuries and
usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an _____ Adjective Tyranny over these
_____ Noun - Plural. To prove this, let Facts be _____ to a candid world.
