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Throughout that first brutal Adjective - Superlative, most of the colonists remained on board the ship, where they suffered from Noun, Noun - Plural and outbreaks of contagious disease. Only half of the Mayflower's Adjective passengers and crew lived to see their first New England spring. In March, the Verb - Present Tense settlers moved ashore, where they received an Adjective visit from an Abenaki Indian who greeted them in English. Several Noun - Plural later, he returned with another Native American, Proper Noun, a member of the Pawtuxet tribe who had been Verb - Past Participle by an English sea captain and Verb - Past Tense into Noun before escaping to London and returning to his homeland on an Noun expedition. Proper Noun taught the Pilgrims, weakened by Noun and Noun, how to Verb corn, extract sap from Noun trees, catch fish in the rivers and avoid Adjective Noun - Plural. He also helped the settlers forge an Noun with the Wampanoag, a local tribe, which would Verb for more than 50 years and Adverb remains one of the Adjective examples of Noun between European colonists and Native Americans.
