Hockey Time

The 1919 Stanley Proper Noun final in Seattle, USA, was cancelled when many members of the Proper Noun Canadiens Noun came down with the Spanish Noun. This flu killed more than 20 million people around the Noun and about 30,000 to 45,000 of them were Canadians. People fell sick whether they lived in crowded cities or on Adjective farms. Proper Noun was one of the cities that was hit Determiner hardest.

When the Montreal Canadiens players became ill, each team Verb - Past Participle won two games, with one Verb - Past Participle tied. The Canadiens' "Bad" Joe Hall, a professional hockey player for eleven years, was one Preposition or subordinating conjunction the ones to get sick. He died in a Seattle hospital on April 5th, four days after the series had been Verb - Past Participle off.

Never before, or since, have Proper Noun Proper Noun Cup Verb - Past Participle been cancelled.
