# How to clean a car

the \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> out of direct sunlight. This prevents premature \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Verb ending in ing</sup> which can leave  
splotches on the paint.

2. make sure the \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Plural noun</sup> are securely closed so no \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Liquid</sup> leaks in.

3. Fill a bucket with water and add car wash \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Liquid</sup> in the quantity directed on its bottle.

4. Fill another bucket with plain \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Liquid</sup>.

\_\_\_\_\_<sup>Present tense verb</sup> off the car to loosen the dirt. Don't use a strong jet, as this can rub grit over the paint and

\_\_\_\_\_<sup>Present tense verb</sup> a large wash mitt or sponge in the soapy water, being certain to wash out any dirt in it, and  
begin applying it to the car. Do not use a \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Present tense verb</sup> on the car body -- this will leave \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Size</sup>  
scratches.

7. Wash the car section by section, starting at the top. \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Shape</sup> around the car several times, washing lower  
areas with each round.

8. Rinse the dirt out of the wash mitt or sponge in the bucket with plain water frequently.
