Easter Eggs

The precise origin of the custom of colouring eggs is not known. Greeks to this day typically dye their Easter eggs red, in recognition of the <u>Verb ending in ing</u> of <u>Plural noun</u> in springtime. Some also use the color green, in honor of the <u>Adjective</u> <u>Plural noun</u> emerging after the long winter. Other colors, including the pastels popular in the United States and elsewehere, symbolizing the rainbow, another seasonal sign of luck and <u>Plural noun</u> seem to have come along later. The act of <u>Verb ending in ing</u> coloured eggs at the Spring Equinox can be considered a form of prayer for increased fertility, and for a <u>Adjective</u>

<u>Verb ending in ing</u>later in the year.
