## Four score seven years ago...Wait, doughnuts have been around

Number score Number years ago...Wait, Noun - Plural have been around longer than eighty-seven years ago. In ancient Rome and Greece, cooks would fry strips of pastry dough and coat them with honey or fish sauce. Arab cooks started frying up small portions of unsweetened yeast dough, drenching the plain fried blobs in sugary syrup to sweeten them. The fritters spread into northern Europe in the 1400?s and became popular <u>Noun</u>, <u>Noun</u> and the <u>Noun</u>. The <u>Noun</u> hole was born. the first printed recipe for doughnuts can be found in an Adjective cookbook dating back to 1803, included as part of an <u>Noun</u> of <u>Proper Noun</u> recipes. Proper Noun took on a patriotic resonance on the front lines of World War I, when Gender Salvation Army workers known as "\_\_\_\_Noun Girls" would fry and distribute Noun - Plural to the Adjective soldiers fighting in Proper Noun . The doughnut also has a rich history in the \_\_\_\_\_\_ culture. \_\_\_\_\_\_ Levitt is responsible for inventing the first automated <u>Noun</u> machine in 1920. <u>Proper Noun</u> were then mentioned as "Hit Food of the Century of Progress" at the 1934 Proper Noun World Fair. Proper Noun Rosenberg was operating an <u>Adjective</u> catering business in which he sold snacks in converted secondhand trucks. He noticed that doughnuts and coffee were the most common sold. You may not know, but <u>Proper Noun</u> later invented a franchise called the <u>Adjective</u> Kettle. Two years after opening, Adjective changed the store's name to Proper Noun Donuts. There were more than 5,000 Noun - Plural open by the time of his death. The \_\_\_\_\_\_ continues to be a popular breakfast snack with lots of shops that sell this \_\_\_\_\_\_ Noun delight. Many places like Tim \_\_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ Kreme's continue to make the classic <u>Noun</u>, but many others have <u>Verb - Past Participle</u> it. Though the doughnut has a long history, it doesn't

take long to sit back, <u>Verb - Base Form</u>, and eat a <u>Noun</u>.
