Edward Snowden Letter

One week ago I left Hong Kong after it became clear that my _____ Noun and safety were under threat for revealing the truth. My continued _____ Noun has been owed to the efforts of _____ Noun new and old, family, and others who I have never met and probably never will. I trusted them with my _____ Noun and they returned that trust with a _____ Noun in me for which I will always be thankful.

On Thursday, President Obama declared before the _____ Noun that he would not permit any diplomatic "wheeling and dealing" over my _____ Noun. Yet now it is being reported that after promising not to do so, the President ordered his Vice President to pressure the leaders of _____ Noun - Plural from which I have requested protection to deny my asylum _____ Noun - Plural.

This kind of deception from a world leader is not _____ Noun, and neither is the extralegal penalty of _____ Noun. These are the old, bad tools of political _____ Noun. Their purpose is to frighten, not me, but those who would come after me.

For decades the United States of America has been one of the strongest defenders of the human right to seek asylum. Sadly, this right, laid out and voted for by the U.S. in Article 14 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, is now being rejected by the current government of my country. The Obama _____ Noun has now adopted the strategy of using citizenship as a _____ Noun. Although I am convicted of nothing, it has unilaterally

revoked my _____^{Noun}_____, leaving me a stateless person. Without any judicial order, the administration now seeks to stop me exercising a basic right. A right that belongs to everybody. The right to seek _____^{Noun}_____.

In the end the Obama administration is not afraid of _____^{Noun - Plural}_____ like me, Bradley Manning or Thomas Drake. We are stateless, imprisoned, or powerless. No, the Obama _____^{Noun}_____ is afraid of you. It is afraid of an informed, angry public demanding the constitutional _____^{Noun}_____ it was promised -- and it should be.
