# RATIOS

A Noun is a comparison of two quantities or numbers that are the same type of measure. A ratio can be written in Adjective different ways. The three ways are: using a Noun, using the word Noun, and in Adjective form. Ratios can be part-to-part or part-to-whole comparisons. A Noun is a special kind of ratio that compares two quantities that are different types of measures. When you are comparing two measurements and the denominator has a value of 1, it is called a Adjective Noun. When two ratios or rates are equal it is called a Noun. When you Verb - Base Form a ratio to an equivalent ratio with greater numbers, you are scaling up. Scaling up means using Noun. When you Verb - Base Form a ratio to an equivalent ratio with lesser numbers, you are scaling down. Scaling down means using Noun.
