The History of Sukkot

During Sukkot we remember when God freed us from slavery in Proper Noun. After our ancestors left Egypt, they Verb - Past Tense for forty years in the desert before they reached the Promised Land of Proper Noun. Along their way during these forty years, they built temporary homes out of dry palms and branches.

To remind us of their journey and these temporary homes, and of how our Noun - Plural relied on God to help them, on Sukkot we 'live' for Number days in huts made from branches and palms.

Sukkot was also an autumn harvest festival, Adverb at the time when the Jewish people Verb - Past Tense the crops from the fields and the fruits of the orchards.

These harvests were always celebrated with great Feeling. As a result, we also call Sukkot 'Chag HaAsif' ('The Festival of Gathering') and 'Zman Simchatenu' ('The Time of Our Happiness').
