# Fatheads

Facebook has removed a "feeling \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective" emoji from its website after its presence caused a backlash from a group that said it promoted " \_\_\_\_\_ Noun \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Present ends in ING."

" We've heard from our community that listing 'feeling \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun - Plural' as an option for status updates could reinforce negative \_\_\_\_\_ Noun image, particularly for people struggling with eating \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural," a Facebook spokeswoman wrote. "So we're going to remove 'feeling \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun - Plural' from the list of options. We'll continue to listen to feedback as we think about ways to help people express themselves on Facebook." (RELATED: Change.org Petition Wants Facebook To Remove 'Feeling Fat' Emoticon)

The eliminated emoticon, or "emoji," showed a smiling \_\_\_\_\_ Noun sporting a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective chin. While not directly suggesting that being \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective was \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective, it still \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Past Tense the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun of Catherine Weingarten and the group \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective Bodies. Weingarten launched a petition on Change.org in late February coincide with National Eating \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural Awareness Week, writing that the the image was "not OK" and "encourag[ed] negative \_\_\_\_\_ Noun image among \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural."
