Levi _____ Adverb began to look for a different textile; soon he found a heavy textile from France; it was called serge de Nimes. Americans just called this de Nimes, _____ Coordinating conjunction this name soon got reduced to denim. Denim was a bit _____ Adjective - Comparative than canvas, but it was very strong; it was ideal for miners. However, original denim was almost white, and miners did not like the color! Their denim trousers got dirty as soon as they began working!

Levi Strauss therefore decided to use colored denim, and he _____ Verb - Past Tense dark blue. In 1873, he began to make denim trousers with metal rivets to make them stronger. This was a radical new idea: "Blue jeans" had _____ Verb - Past Tense! Levi's jeans were so popular, that _____ Pronoun company got bigger and bigger; soon, other firms were making blue jeans too. Miners liked them, but so did cowboys and other working men. Blue jeans _____ Verb - Past Tense classic American working trousers.

After the Second World War, jeans became popular all _____ Preposition the world. Today, blue jeans are made over

the world - most of them in Asia. Very few jeans are now made in the USA, because of the cost:
