# The Parts of the Hand

You have \_\_\_\_\_ Number hands, each with five \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural. The short fat one is called the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun. It is used to give the Okay, and to say that you're \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective. If you point your thumb \_\_\_\_\_ Noun, then you would not be great, but \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective. You use these to play \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural.

The next finger is called the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective finger or the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective finger. You need this to \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form at things, like \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural, \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural, and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural. Next to this finger is the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective finger, the longest of the bunch. Some use it to point, some to \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form. It is pretty good for flicking \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural across the table. Otherwise, it is useless. The next finger is the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective finger, because that is where rings go. If you put a \_\_\_\_\_ Noun on the left one, then you would be married! If you put it on the right one, then you would be \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective! Now if you put it on both, then you would be married and \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective. The ring finger is hard to \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form on its own. Next, and last, is the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective finger, the baby \_\_\_\_\_ Noun of them all. It is so important for playing guitar and \_\_\_\_\_ Noun. It is pretty \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective, so watch out for \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural when you use it--you might get hurt if you don't take care of it. And then on the inside of the hand is the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun, the flat part with all the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural. This is where you hold \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural, before eating or throwing them. On the other side, the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective side of the hand are your \_\_\_\_\_ Noun - Plural. They are hard and boney. They are fun to \_\_\_\_\_ Verb - Base Form, but don't get carried away with that!
