Ladies and gentlemen, I'd like to direct your attention to the television monitors. We will be showing our safety demonstration and would like the next few minutes of your Adjective - Ends in EST attention.

When the seat belt sign Verb - Present ends in S, you must fasten your seat belt. Verb - Base Form the metal fittings one into the other, and tighten by pulling on the loose end of the strap. To Verb - Base Form your seat belt, lift the Adjective - Ends in EST portion of the buckle. We suggest that you keep your seat belt Adjective throughout the flight, as we may experience Noun.

There are several Adjective exits on this aircraft- forward, aft, and over each Noun. Please take a few moments now to locate your nearest Noun. In some cases, your nearest Repeat Last Noun may be behind you. If we need to evacuate the aircraft, floor-level Noun - Plural will guide you towards the Repeat Last Noun. Doors can be opened by moving the Noun in the direction of the Noun. Each door is equipped with an Adjective slide which may also be detached and used as a Adjective raft.

Oxygen and the air pressure are always being monitored. In the event of a Event, an oxygen Noun will automatically appear in front of you. To start the flow of oxygen, pull the Repeat Last Noun towards you. Place it firmly over your Part of Body and Part of Body, secure the Adjective band

behind your head, and breathe normally. Although the bag does not inflate, oxygen is flowing to the Repeat Last

Noun _____. If you are travelling with a Animal _____ or someone who requires assistance, secure your Repeat Last _____

Noun _____ first, and then assist the other person. Keep your Repeat Last Noun _____ on until a Adjective _____ crew member advises you to remove it.

In the event of an Event _____, please assume the bracing position. Lean forward with your hands on top of your Part of Body _____ and your Part of Body _____ against your Part of Body _____. Ensure your Part of Body _____ are flat on the floor.

A Adjective _____ vest is located in a Noun _____ under your Noun _____ or between the Noun - _____ Plural _____. When instructed to do so, open the Adjective _____ pouch and remove the vest. Slip it over your Part of Body _____. Pass the Noun - Plural _____ around your Part of Body _____ and adjust at the front. To inflate the vest, pull firmly on the Adjective _____ cord, only when leaving the aircraft. If you need to refill the vest, blow into the Noun - Plural _____. Use the Noun _____ and Noun _____ to attract attention. Also, your seat bottom cushion can be used as a Noun _____ device. Pull the cushion from the seat, slip your Part of Body _____ into the straps, and hug the cushion to your Part of Body _____.

At this time, your portable Adjective _____ devices must be set to Noun _____ mode until an announcement is made upon arrival.
