# How to remove a shrub or bush

We know that \_\_\_\_\_ Full Name of a Person would pay a contractor to remove a shrub or bush from his \_\_\_\_\_ Noun but the rest of us usually take care of something like this ourselves.

There's two common ways to remove a shrub or bush but you won't be happy with the results from these methods. One, dig the \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective root system up with a \_\_\_\_\_ Noun and try to pull out the shrub or bush out. This is back breaking work and it's unlikely you'll be able to dig around and through a \_\_\_\_\_ Repeat Last Adjective root system. Two, use a \_\_\_\_\_ Noun to cut the trunk of the shrub or bush at ground level. If you're planning to replant in the area this approach will only cause more work and/or inhibit the growth of new plants.

So what should you do? Take advantage of the most powerful tool you already own, your \_\_\_\_\_ Noun. It is advisable to utilize a \_\_\_\_\_ Repeat Last Noun with a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective hitch or tow hook system. Consult your \_\_\_\_\_ Repeat Last Noun manual if necessary. A Four wheel drive or all wheel drive \_\_\_\_\_ Repeat Last Noun works best.
