Curling is a Noun that originated in Location. It is a Adjective sport that is played on a Adjective sheet of Noun. Curling is similar to the Noun of Noun. Players take turns Verb Present ends in ING Noun granite Noun Plural across the Noun. These stones weigh an average of Number Noun Plural use their Noun Plural and Noun Plural to Verb Base Form the friction between the Noun and the Noun. A typical game is played in Number ends. In each Noun, Number stones are Verb Past Tense. The team with the Adjective Ends in EST stone to the center of the Location Verb Present ends in S. That Noun scores one point for each stone closer than their opponent's Adjective Ends in EST. Sometimes a team will deliberately Verb Base Form an end (score no Noun Plural), which means they shoot last in the next Noun. Curling is a Adjective game
