Attendance policy/tardy policy

If a student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to get all <u>Noun</u> from the teacher.

Late work policy

Every quarter, students will receive 4 <u>Noun</u> in their <u>Noun</u> classes. Each ticket can be used on late assignments in that class. No work will be <u>Verb Past Tense</u> without a late ticket. At the end of the quarter, unused tickets can be redeemed for 5 extra <u>Noun</u> points per ticket.

No late work will be accepted from a completed unit. If <u>Noun</u> from the <u>Noun</u> are discussed in class, late work will not be accepted. The tickets will only work on small <u>Noun</u> and <u>Noun</u>.

Homework policy

<u>Noun</u> are encouraged to take their classroom <u>Noun</u> home and review the material from that day. Students will be expected to complete assignments during class <u>Noun</u>. <u>Noun</u> will be assigned to support concepts or if students are not using class time wisely and fall behind on an in class assignment, they will be assigned the work not completed in class as homework. Additionally, students are expected to use complete sentences, proper grammar and correct usage whenever they write in class or on

outside

assignments. Homework assignments and due dates will be <u>Verb Past Tense</u> to the student when they are assigned and posted visibly in class and recorded in the student's planner. It is the responsibility of the <u>Noun</u> to ask for help, know when their assignment is due, and ensure that the assignment is turned in on time.

At-Home Learning

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Students are expected to log on to their Google Classroom and participate or complete assignments for the athome day. Students will be required to watch a <u>Noun</u> with the daily expectations, complete the <u>Noun</u> for that day, and submit work in preparation for in-class <u>Verb Present ends in ING</u>.

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
