# Ben Simmons' bounce-back

NEW YORK -- Brooklyn Nets coach Steve Nash said he was "proud of" Ben Simmons for the way the

\_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ Noun bounced back in Friday night's 109-105 win over the Toronto \_\_\_\_\_ Noun  
\_\_\_\_\_ Plural after a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective showing in the Nets' season opener.

"A step up for Ben," Nash said after seeing Simmons score \_\_\_\_\_ Number points, grab \_\_\_\_\_ Number  
rebounds, dish out \_\_\_\_\_ Number assists and block two \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural in 32 minutes. "From the jump he

\_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural. ... He's starting to show the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun he can \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Base Form, and I still think he's  
got a ways to go, so \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb proud of him. He shook off the first night, and I thought he was much more  
\_\_\_\_\_ Adjective in an \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective game for us."

Simmons \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Past Tense in Wednesday's loss to the New Orleans \_\_\_\_\_ Animal - Plural, scoring just  
\_\_\_\_\_ Number points to go with five \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural and five \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural and fouling out in  
\_\_\_\_\_ Number minutes. Simmons says he has been getting a \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective \_\_\_\_\_ Noun from Nash for a  
while now.

"Just \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Base Form," Simmons said. "Just be me. It's \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective to say, but to go and do it, it's

Simmons' \_\_\_\_\_ Noun Plural have \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb stood up for him publicly as he continues to find his

\_\_\_\_\_ Noun from the Philadelphia \_\_\_\_\_ Proper Noun last season and then dealing with offseason  
\_\_\_\_\_ Part of Body surgery. The Nets know they can be a \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective team when  
Simmons \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Present ends in S at a high level and is \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective on the \_\_\_\_\_ Location.

"He just got downhill -- he just \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Past Tense \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb," Durant said of Simmons. "He didn't  
\_\_\_\_\_ Verb Base Form too much. I think we're all \_\_\_\_\_ Adverb \_\_\_\_\_ Adjective to start \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Present  
\_\_\_\_\_ ends in ING, start the season last game, so we had a better start to the \_\_\_\_\_ Noun. He \_\_\_\_\_ Verb Past Tense
