Imus began as a radio disc jockey in 1966 at radio station KUTY in Palmdale, California. After hearing the <u>Adjective</u> disc-jockey, he went to the nearby <u>Proper noun</u> and convinced the owner to hire him, saying he could do a better job. At the time, he was a brakeman on the Southern Pacific Railroad. He stayed at the station for about two years, leaving in 1968. After being <u>Past tense verb</u> in Stockton, he went to KXOA in Sacramento, California. His on-air pranks, such as calling up a restaurant and ordering 1200 <u>Plurat</u>

Don Imus behavior has often drawn the attention of the press. He famously called Rush Limbaugh a fat, pillpopping <u>Noun</u> and Lesley Stahl a gutless, lying <u>Noun</u>.

His radio show, Imus in the Morning, aired weekday mornings in the drive time slot from 1979 until it was canceled on April 12, 2007 following public objections to <u>Plural noun</u> he <u>Past tense verb</u> on-air.
