# Satellite Radio

A satellite radio is a \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Adjective</sup> radio signal that is broadcast by a communications \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> which covers a much wider geographical range than terrestrial radio signals.

Satellite radio functions any place there is line of \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> between the antenna and the satellite, as long as there are no major obstructions, such as tunnels or \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Plural noun</sup>. SR audiences can follow a single channel regardless of location within a given range.

Satellite radio is currently at the forefront of the evolution of \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> services in some countries, notably the \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Proper noun</sup> States, but is less prominent in countries with relatively high population densities, where it is easier to reach the bulk of the \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Plural noun</sup> with terrestrial broadcasts, such as the United \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Location</sup>. In the UK and some other countries the contemporary evolution of radio services is focused on Digital Audio Broadcasting (DAB) services rather than on \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Adjective</sup> \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Plural noun</sup>.
