# A Biography of Sir Thomas Sean Connery

Thomas Sean Connery was born in \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Town</sup> \_\_\_\_\_<sup>State</sup> to Euphemia \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Name</sup> a cleaning  
\_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> and Joseph Connery, a \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> and \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Occupation</sup>. His father was a Roman Catholic

He claims he was called Sean, his middle name, long before becoming an \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> explaining that when

Connery's breakthrough came in the role of secret agent \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Last name</sup>. He played the character in seven  
Bond

films: Dr. No, From \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Location</sup> with Love, \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Movie title</sup> \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Movie title</sup> You Only Live Twice,  
\_\_\_\_\_<sup>Plural noun</sup> Are Forever, and Never Say \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup> Again. All \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Number</sup> films were  
commercially successful.

James Bond's creator, Ian Fleming, doubted the casting, saying, 'He's not what I \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Past tense verb</sup> of James  
Bond looks' and 'I'm looking for \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Adjective</sup> Bond and not an overgrown \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup>, adding that  
Connery was unrefined. However, Fleming's girlfriend told him Connery had the requisite sexual \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Noun</sup>.  
Fleming changed his mind after the successful Dr. No premiere; he was so \_\_\_\_\_<sup>Past tense verb</sup> he created a
